Honda

The main attraction at the Honda stand should be the new City. This "made-for-Asia" model has become a core Honda product and the latest version has lots to offer.

Powered by a Euro IV 1.5-litre i-Vtec engine that delivers 120 horsepower (10 more than its predecessor), the car is expected to be zippy and efficient.

It is also longer, wider and sits lower. Its wheelbase is extended by 100mm to match the Toyota Vios' 2,550mm. At the same time, it looks more stylish.

The new Jazz supermini will also be there, as will Honda's Formula One car.

Concept car

The Rinspeed sQuba, the world's first working submarine car, will be a show stealer. Who knows? You might even get a "test-dive".
